
## Student dormitory accommodation safety features

Secure under bed storage

Secure dorm accommodation windows

Padlock required to secure under bed storage

Max. 100mm gap for windows opened above ground floor









Secure steps to top bunk bed

Safety rails bars on top beds





Internally, door can be opened at all times without a key by room occupants

Externally, doors can only be accessed via a room key card.

Door locks operate a security alarm if door does not securely close


